


WHAT HAVE YOU FOUND OUT?



IN JUNE 2022, NATIONAL HERITAGE REPLIED TO THE ANTONIO ROBLES ATHENAEUM'S EMAIL:



Dear Sirs, the marble used was from Robledo. That decision was made in 1763, after a period of hesitation, because initially—in 1761—Sabatini and the king had planned to use white marble from Urda. The final decision, which also depended on whether each step could be made from a single piece, as the king wanted, was not made until 1764, and the staircase wasn't completed until 1767.

...THE KING CHOSE WHICH ORNAMENTAL STONE TO USE FOR BUILDING EACH PART OF THE PALACE...



...TO MAKE THINGS EASIER, THE PALACE ARCHITECTS CREATED A SERIES OF DISPLAY CASES SHOWCASING SPAIN'S MOST SPECTACULAR ORNAMENTAL STONES—THAT IS, A KIND OF SAMPLE COLLECTION.



EACH CASE CONSISTED OF 40 SMALL SAMPLES MADE FROM DIFFERENT POLISHED STONES.

THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 8 CASES, WHICH NATIONAL HERITAGE HAS BEAUTIFULLY RESTORED AND RECENTLY DISPLAYED IN AN EXHIBITION CALLED "HIS MAJESTY CHOOSES".





THE STONE FOR THE STAIRCASE, BUT A PROBLEM COMES UP...




THIS IS A BIG PROBLEM.




HANDWRITTEN LETTER FROM THE ARCHIVES OF THE ROYAL PALACE OF MADRID MENTIONING THE DISCOVERY OF THE QUARRIES IN ROBLEDO DE CHAVELA IN 1763.

THE FULL TEXT READS...

"Dated July 27th, I was informed by the Most Excellent Marquis of Esquilache of His Majesty's order as follows:

The King wishes that the discovery of the Robledo de Chavela marble quarry be carried out, sending one of the scapellinos who came from Rome to the said town; and that, once it is confirmed that the steps for the staircase of the New Palace can be made from a single piece, the proposals presented shall be accepted..."

THESE GRAND IMPERIAL STAIRS HAVE A GENTLE SLOPE AND STEPS MADE FOR EASY CLIMBING.

THIS IS HOW CHARLES III WANTED IT.



THEY WERE, AND STILL ARE, VERY MUCH ADMIRE, ESPECIALLY FOR THEIR 104 STEPS, EACH MADE FROM A SINGLE PIECE OF MARBLE... AND LET'S NOT FORGET: IT'S THE MARBLE FROM ROBLEDO DE CHAVELA!
